### **Peterborough Holiday Voucher Scheme – Summer Holiday**

Currently this is expected to be the last time the holiday vouchers will be issued as the governments six-month extension of the Household Support Fund has come to an end. This will be a single **£50** voucher issued just before the Summer Holiday starts. Please activate your voucher **as soon as possible** because the deadline to claim the voucher is **Midnight on Sunday 11th August 2024**.

Appendix 1 of this letter outlines the different income related eligibility criteria based upon a child's age. For eligible young people attending sixth form colleges/further education establishments, information on how support will be offered will be sent directly by the college.

Details of how to apply for income related Free School Meals, if you have not already done so, can be found [here](#). There is a [simple application form](#) which only requires a few details and will instantly check if you are eligible. Each successful application will also bring up to £1,500 additional funding for your child's school. Children in an Early Years setting need to ask the provider to run an Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) check.

For the Summer Holiday, our scheme will operate as follows –

- **All vouchers must be claimed by Midnight on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> August 2024.**
- If vouchers are unclaimed, we are unable to reinstate them after this date. This is a shorter timeframe than previous rounds due to reporting deadlines for the Council that have been set by the Department for Work and Pensions.
- Each eligible child/young person will be issued a £50 voucher via email and/or text. This will be sent on **Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> July**. You will be able to choose from ten different retailers.
- Vouchers may take until **9pm on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> July** to arrive. Look out for an email or text message from Evouchers.com ([no-reply@evouchers.com](mailto:no-reply@evouchers.com)) with a link to access your voucher(s). If you receive multiple vouchers, your email provider may group the emails together.
- If you haven't received your voucher link, please contact [support@evouchers.com](mailto:support@evouchers.com)
- Any children who become eligible up until the 2<sup>nd</sup> of August will also receive vouchers. These will be sent when we are notified of newly eligible children by our Education Welfare Benefits Team or Early Years Settings.
- Details of the supermarkets which will accept the vouchers and how the voucher scheme works can be found in the frequently asked questions document sent with this letter.
- If you **do not** wish to receive the food vouchers, please let your school or setting know as soon as possible so that we can reallocate them.

## Appendix 1 – Eligibility for Direct Voucher Scheme

Parents eligible for Funded Childcare and Education for 2-year-olds under the income-based criteria (children aged 2 with a date of birth between 1<sup>st</sup> April 2021 and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022)

In order to qualify you must be in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- [Income Support](#)
- Income-based [Jobseeker's Allowance](#) (JSA)
- Income-related [Employment and Support Allowance](#) (ESA)
- [Universal Credit](#), and your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, not including benefit payments
- The guaranteed element of [Pension Credit](#)
- [Child Tax Credit](#), [Working Tax Credit](#) (or both), and your household income is £16,190 a year or less before tax
- The Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

Parents eligible for Early Years Pupil Premium under the income-based criteria (children aged 3 and 4 with a date of birth between 1<sup>st</sup> April 2019 and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021)

In order to qualify you must be in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- [Income Support](#)
- Income-based [Jobseeker's Allowance](#) (JSA)
- Income-related [Employment and Support Allowance](#) (ESA)
- Support under [part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999](#)
- The guaranteed element of [State Pension Credit](#)
- [Child Tax Credit](#) (provided you are not also entitled to [Working Tax Credit](#)) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- [Working Tax Credit](#) run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- [Universal Credit](#) - your household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax not including any benefits you get

Parents eligible for Free School Meals (children and young people aged 4 to 16)

In order to qualify you must be in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- [Income Support](#)
- Income-based [Jobseeker's Allowance](#) (JSA)
- Income-related [Employment and Support Allowance](#) (ESA)
- Support under [Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999](#)
- The guaranteed element of [Pension Credit](#)
- [Child Tax Credit](#) (provided you are not also entitled to [Working Tax Credit](#)) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- [Working Tax Credit](#) run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- [Universal Credit](#) - if you applied on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get Free School Meals.

### Eligible for 16-19 Free School Meals

Students must be enrolled in Further Education provision funded by the Education Skills Funding Agency and be in receipt of, or have parents who are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs (HMRC))
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after someone stops qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit with net earnings not exceeding the equivalent of £7,400 per annum (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

### Other Eligibility

Children in care are not covered by the scheme as the costs of meals in the holidays are covered by fostering allowances.

and the definition of a child is any person:

- under the age of 19 as at the 25th May 2024
- aged 19 or over in respect of whom a child-related benefit (for example Child Benefit) is paid or Free School Meals are provided
- aged 19 to 25 and have an EHCP and accesses the bursary scheme or free school meals in their college.

### How to Claim Free School Meals

We understand that families continue to live in uncertain times, and many are facing changes to their financial circumstances as a result. If you have not previously applied for Free School Meals, or your name has recently changed, and feel you now meet the criteria below, please visit [www.peterborough.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals](https://www.peterborough.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals) to apply online;

- Income Support.
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance.
- Child Tax Credit - but no element of Working Tax Credit - and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC)) that does not exceed £16,190.
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work fewer hours per week.
- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.

### Healthy Start Scheme
