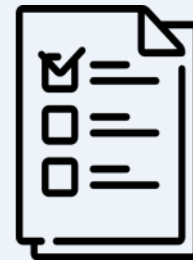

Our learning



During our lessons we do many different activities to teach students how to reproduce the language. Our students take part in lots of different activities to help them with their reproduction of language. Here are some examples of the amazing written work.

Facts about Spain



1. **The Tooth Fairy is a mouse:** In the UK, when children lose a tooth, they leave it under their pillow, and during the night, the Tooth Fairy replaces it with money. Well, in Spain it's similar, but instead of a fairy, they have a mouse named Ratoncito Pérez .



2. **Spain is UNESCO rich :** With 48 UNESCO World Heritage Sites, Spain ranks second in Europe and third globally. The most famous ones are the Alhambra fortress in Granada, the works of Antoni Gaudi (including Sagrada Familia) in Barcelona, and the pilgrimage route – Camino de Santiago.



3. **Greeting:** People greet each other and say goodbye with a kiss on each cheek. In fact, these aren't really proper kisses at all. People usually touch their right cheeks together and make a kissing sound, then repeat the process on the left side.



4. **Surnames:** Everyone has two surnames, which they take from their father (first surname) and their mother (second surname). A woman keeps her surnames when she gets married instead of adopting the surnames of her husband.



5. **Siesta:** Spanish are able to commute all the way home to have a midday nap, but many shops still close at lunchtime – usually from 2 pm to 4 or 5 pm. Major chains, however, are normally open all day without interruption.

FESTIVALS



Fiesta de San Juan is celebrated on June 23rd, the day of the summer solstice. The main component of the festival is fire, a symbol of the sun. People gather together and create large bonfires from any kind of wood, and share food and drinks.


Jumping over a bonfire three times cleanses and purifies bad luck, but obviously this entails some risk, so it's best to choose one of the 'safer' rituals, like bathing in the sea at midnight, jumping backwards over the waves to eliminate negative energy, or the simplest option is to simply wet your feet and make a wish


