## CHARACTERS

### Act 1 Scene 1: On the ship

A violent storm rages around a ship containing King Alonso, Ferdinand, Antonio, Gonzalo, Sebastian, and others.

#### Act 1 Scene 2: The Island

Prospero and Miranda stand on the shore witnessing the shipwreck. Prospero tells Miranda how he was once the Duke of Milan, but his brother Antonio usurped him with Alonso. His loyal aide Gonzalo, helped Prospero and baby Miranda to escape the island with food, water and his magic books. When arriving to the island, Prospero torments Caliban (slave) who laments that the island was once his. Ariel, Prospero's loyal servant brings Ferdinand to the island, and he falls in love with Miranda immediately. Prospero instructs him to complete tasks.

#### Act 2 Scene 1: Other side of the Island

Alonso, Sebastian, Antonio, and Gonzalo search for Ferdinand. Alonso blames himself for arranging the trip to Africa for his daughter's wedding. Ariel enters and sends all except Antonio and Sebastian to sleep. Antonio convinces Sebastian to murder Alonso.

### Act 2 Scene 2: The jester, the drunk and the monster

Trinculo and Stephano meet Caliban and compare him to a freak show. They all become drunk together, Caliban begs to worship Stephano, so they mock him.

### Act 3 Scene 1: Love at first sight

Ferdinand stops his work to speak to Miranda. They declare their love for one another and agree to get married. Prospero observes from afar and prepares for his magical business.

### Act 3 Scene 2: Terrible trip are back

Caliban, Trinculo, and Stephano continue to wander around the island. Stephano refers to Caliban as "servant monster" and frequently commands him to drink. Caliban tells Trinculo of his poor treatment from Prospero; they plan to steal his magic books so they can kill him and make Miranda his queen. Ariel looks on.

#### Act 3 Scene 3:

Alonso begins to give up hope of finding Ferdinand. Antonio suggests that this exasperation should provide the perfect opportunity to kill Alonso. They hear music and see a banquet of food. Ariel appears with a clap of thunder and laments Alonso, Sebastian, and Antonio for driving Prospero from Milan.

#### Act 4 Scene 1:

Prospero gives his blessing to Ferdinand and Miranda, so longs as he takes care not to take her virginity before marriage. Ariel summons spirits to perform a masque for them in celebration.

### Act 5 Scene 1:

Prospero speaks to the prisoners. He forgives each of them and commends Gonzalo for his loyalty. As Antonio grieves the loss of his son, Prospero reveals Ferdinand and Miranda. He frees Ariel. They plan to set sail for Naples and Milan.

### Epilogue:

Prospero decides to give up his magic powers and be free.

## CONTEXT

- Shakespeare wrote around 37 plays for the theatre and over 150 sonnets.
- 2. The Tempest is likely to have been the last play written entirely by Shakespeare and was written/performed in the Jacobean era.
- 3. The Tempest is set in Italy alongside many of his other plays.
- 4. Before science and technology, there was heavy belief in magic and the supernatural.
- 5. James I believed in witches.
- A Shakespearean society was typically a patriarchal one. Women were inferior to men. Women belonged to their fathers, brothers and their husbands.
- 7. **The Colonial Era:** Shakespearean audiences would have been interested in the efforts of English (and other Europeans) settlers to colonise distant lands around the world.
- 8. These ideas are prevalent in the plot as almost every man that sets foot on the island dreams about ruling it.
