


In celebration of World Poetry Day, I will be running a Black Out Poetry Competition!

Closing date 27<sup>th</sup> March




Blackout poetry, is a form of poetry where a poet takes an existing text and erases, blacks out, or otherwise obscures a large portion of the text, creating a whole new piece of work from what remains.




Alternatively, Miss Brownlie has some pages from some old books that you can use.

Step 2
Skim the passage and keep your eye out for that eye-catching word that will guide the theme of your poem.



## Step 3

Read the poem in its entirety. Go back and circle words or short phrases that might relate to your eyecatching word or phrase.



## Step 4

Make your final decisions and black out the rest of the poem! Your poem can be made up of single words or phrases. They can be single words, or they can be read like a story. It's totally up to you!
